PARADE RULES AND REGULATIONS

The parade chairperson is Linda Jeffers Bagley '69. Register floats by calling 603-448-2142 or email lindasue216@yahoo.com. Floats must be registered WITH THE PARADE CHAIR by June 1st in order to be eligible for judging. First come, first registered. Floats not registered by June 1st are still welcome.

1. Floats are to enter at the Village Pizza from 9:30 to 10:00 AM. There will be someone there to direct you to your staging area.

PLEASE NOTE: ONLY FLOATS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE LINE-UP AREA

Parade participants MUST park personal vehicles in an adjoining lot - DO NOT ASK THE SECURITY GUARD TO LET YOU ENTER - YOU WILL BE TURNED AWAY.

2. Float participants need to be on the float no later than 10:45 AM for judging.

3. Children are allowed on your float, but **THEY MUST BE SUPERVISED BY AN ADULT.**

4. Classes are required to have their theme and year of graduation on the front of the float.

5. No part of the float shall measure higher than 12 feet from the pavement.

6. **STATE LAW:** The open space between the flatbed/truck base and the top of all wheels must be completely covered with a cardboard like material to prevent injury.

7. There will be **NO DRINKING OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES** on or around the floats at any time before or during the parade -This is grounds for disqualification.

8. **NOTHING IS TO BE THROWN FROM THE FLOAT** - This is grounds for disqualification. Participants walking alongside their float may toss candy/treats into the crowd and AWAY from the float.

9. All floats will be judged in the following areas:

A. Appearance

1. Quality (10 pts)

Handmade (5 pts) costumes, signs, decorations, furniture
Finished Look (5 pts) painted, no rough edges, overall coverage of trailer

2. Action (10 pts)

Technology (5 pts) water, mechanics, lights, sound
Class energy (5 pts) actions appropriate to theme, continuous throughout parade, having fun

B. How well theme is carried out (10 pts)

1. To parade theme (5 pts)

2. To your float theme (5 pts)

NOTE: PLEASE REMEMBER TO THANK YOUR TRUCK DRIVERS. Even though you may have paid for the use of your trailer, that is usually for the trailer only. The drivers come out year after year for us and usually on their own time. Please think about compensating your driver. We suggest a gratuity of \$100.

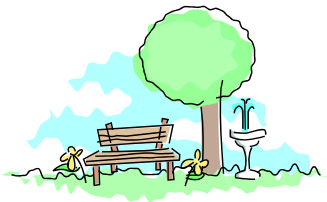

IT'S TIME TO SAY GOOD-BYE TO OUR OLD AND CHERISHED SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Once touted as the finest high school in New Hampshire, Lebanon Junior High School, formerly Lebanon High School, will close its doors at the end of the 2012 school year. Its high ceilings, 300 seat auditorium, state of the art gym, and spacious classrooms were once the models for new construction of schools in the 1920s. The Granite State Free Press concluded that the new school would bring Lebanon into the 20th century and was one of the finest high schools in the state. Built in 1926, the school served as the high school until 1958 when a new high school building was built onto the existing Hanover Street School. The Bank Street building then housed grades eight and nine until 1970 and later on served as the city's Junior High School with grades 7 and 8. In 1987, the school won the prestigious Presidential Blue Ribbon Award of Excellence.

In 2010, voters in the city voted to build a new school building for grades 5-8. The new school is scheduled to open in the fall of 2012, putting the Lebanon Junior High School (formerly Lebanon High School) and Seminary Hill School (formerly West Lebanon High School) on the list of closed buildings, along with School Street School and Sacred Heart Public School. There are many memories and good times shared at these fine institutions. The Lebanon School Board is in the process of deciding what to do with all four historical buildings. A Real Estate Committee consisting of school board members has been meeting to determine the fate of the buildings. At this time, School Street School (another former Lebanon High School) and Sacred Heart Public School are up for sale.

On the March ballot will be a warrant (Warrant Article 2) for voters to vote on a bond for \$750,000 to demolish the Lebanon Junior High School, last used as

Lebanon High School in 1958. Please make sure to cast your vote on March 13th! If you live in Lebanon and are not a registered voter, you may register to vote that day at the polls.

Lebanon Middle School (LMS) will be a "green" school meeting many criteria for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification. It will even have a garden on the roof! The technology will be state of the art and the core facilities will meet a growing need in our city for gymnasiums and fields for sports. The new school was built to accommodate 600 students and will open with an enrollment of approximately 470 students. When you come into Lebanon, take Exit 17 and head toward the center of Lebanon. You will see the building located just past LaPlante Road on the left below Hillcrest Acres. You can't miss it!

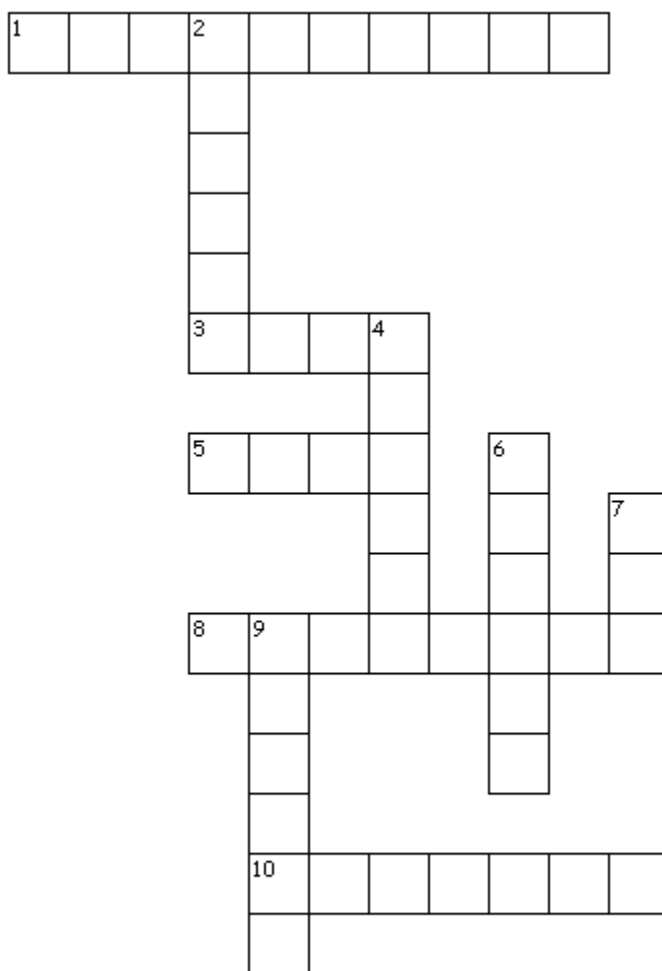

A big Thank You is also sent out to all of the truck drivers and companies that supplied the trailers and trucks. Year after year, you are always there for us.

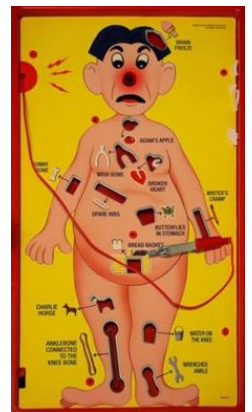


Our honorary parade marshal this year was Frank Hough, co-founder – along with Robert Jones and Maxine Nelson – of our Alumni Association. Even

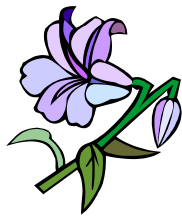
